To the clerk of Loppington Parish Council

Dear Lynda,

I am a member of the fundraising group for St. Michaels & All Angels church. As the leader of this year's Flower Festival, I suggested that an approach be made for support from the Community Benefit Fund. My husband, Bob Parker, a member of Loppington Parish Council as well as being both a churchwarden & member of the PCC, said that he would put the appeal forward on the fundraising groups behalf. I understand the need for procedures when safeguarding public money. I hope the following will help any concerns in relation to the request.

The purpose of 'A Year in the Life of a Village Church' flower festival is to raise funds to enable the church to pay its Parish share and for its upkeep. It aims to be a celebration of the community, bringing them together and encouraging them to visit a local amenity and showing what is required to keep the church alive and part of the village.

Letters to Hawk, Wem Co-op, Edgertons, Rhian Greaves & Grindalls Funeral Directors asking for sponsorship for the festival were sent, achieving some success. There is some money in the church flower fund available. The church flower arrangers have been asked to finance their own displays. Mrs Stokes has organised and paid for the cascade of poppies project. People have been asked to donate flowers and foliage from their gardens, as well as draw prizes and refreshments. A private donation has also been received.

It is not possible to estimate the full cost of putting on the flower festival. By using local talent & their generosity, it is hoped that the festival can be put on as economically as possible. It is known that 60 blocks of oasis will be required - £60, programme printing - £100, which will leave £350 of the £500 requested for flowers. Some of that money will be used to financially support the flower arrangers as larger flower displays than they usually do will be expected.

The flower festival is already benefitting the community. People from the local community including the WI, have been involved in knitting poppies for the cascade of poppies. It is encouraging people to co-operate, communicate and develop skills. The festival is a project that many will be able to say they have contributed to which will increase their self-worth.

Hoping that the above is of help. If I can be of any further help, do ask.
