g) Budget:

Members received the tax base figures from Shropshire Council which confirmed that to maintain a 0% increase in council tax the precept figure is £3,887 compared to £3,879 in 2022 and £3,900 in 2021, therefore there has been a decrease in actual payments over the previous two years whilst costs are increasing. The national pay award increases salaries by 8%. This years' insurance & meeting room hire increased by circa 20%. SALC affiliation fees have also increased. Maintenance on Council Property was over £230 this year and in excess of £550 last year compared to £144 in 20/21 and £20 in 19/20, this is because previously Councillors volunteered their time to maintain Council property. This is a significant increase in spending when compared to the precept.

Overall running costs this year anticipated to be £5,343 and last year were £4,782 RESOLVED: Members agreed that the precept should increase by not more than 10% this year which is max. £4,267
